Summary of Offenses and Probable Cause Affidavit

On 10/08/14 Officer Mohamed responded to [redacted] in reference to a Domestic dispute. When he arrived he met victim, [redacted], and witness, [redacted].

[redacted] reported to Officer Mohamed she, her [redacted] and [redacted] year old [redacted] and [redacted] were leaving [redacted] located at [redacted] when the defendant approached them and started yelling, screaming and cursing. They all got into [redacted] car to get away from the defendant. [redacted] stated they started driving south towards her home located at [redacted] in Port Saint Lucie and the defendant followed in his silver Ford F150 crew cab truck. [redacted] said the defendant was tailgating [redacted] car which caused them to fear for their lives. [redacted] turned around and headed back towards Fort Pierce to [redacted] where her [redacted] resides. The complex is a gated community and upon arrival when [redacted] entered the gate code to enter and the defendant drove his truck in directly behind [redacted] before the gate could go back down. Inside the complex the defendant boxed [redacted] vehicle in with his truck. [redacted] stated she believes the had armed himself with one of his handguns when he exited the truck and reported to Officer Mohamed she saw the defendant put a gun and holster on his hip but was unable to describe the type and color of the gun. [redacted] stated the defendant approached the vehicle yelling and screaming obscenities. [redacted] started honking her horn and called 911, at which point the defendant got in his vehicle and fled the scene. [redacted] said she and her [redacted] have been separated for years and he has been arrested for domestic battery on 1/28/2011. Also, [redacted] said the defendant has physically hurt their [redacted] and her and her [redacted] are in fear of their lives. [redacted] filled out a victim statement and was given Domestic Violence Packet. [redacted] and [redacted] requested an escort to their home in Port Saint Lucie because they were in fear of their safety. Deputy Lopez of St. Lucie County and Officer Mohamed escorted [redacted] and [redacted] to their residence in Port Saint Lucie. Upon arrival at 2210 Hours [redacted] informed Officer Mohamed that the defendant called her phone several times. At 2345 Hours [redacted] called Officer Mohamed to inform him the defendant has been calling her as well and text messaging. Officer Mohamed requested via dispatch to send a unit from Port St. Lucie Police Department in an attempt to locate the defendant to no avail.

On 10/9/14 Officer Stokes was called to [REDACTED] reference an escort for safety. When Officer Stokes arrived [REDACTED] asked if she could be transported to Fort Pierce Police Department so she and her [REDACTED] could go to SafeSpace. Officer Stokes then looked into the incident and located a possible address of the defendant, 602 Biltmore Drive Port St. Lucie. Officer Stokes requested via dispatch to send a unit from Port St. Lucie in an attempt to locate the defendant. Officer Stokes was informed Port St. Lucie Police located the defendant and they held him for Officer Stokes. Officer Stokes then transported the defendant to the Fort Pierce Police Department Detective Bureau where I interviewed him.

I met with the defendant at the Fort Pierce Police Department Detective Bureau and recorded our interview. I read the defendant Miranda Warning from a Miranda Warning Waiver Form. The defendant stated understands his rights and informed me he had called his attorney who is on the way. The defendant said he will talk to me and stop if he wishes until his attorney arrived.

The defendant stated he went to [REDACTED] last night because he knew his [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] would be there for [REDACTED]. The defendant explained he and his [REDACTED] are getting a [REDACTED] and he has not seen or talked with his [REDACTED] in three or four weeks. The defendant asked his [REDACTED] if he could drive the [REDACTED] home so he could spend some time with them. He stated she refused and [REDACTED] told his [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] to get into her car. The defendant did follow [REDACTED] car because he wanted to find out where his [REDACTED] are going. When they got to [REDACTED] the defendant said he left willingly and added no officer had to tell him to leave. I asked the defendant if he had a gun and he explained he does own guns but did not have any with him last night. The defendant said he has a long gun for hunting he does not keep at his home and he has a 9mm hand gun which is at his friend's house. He explained four weeks ago [REDACTED] stole his truck on his [REDACTED] and while they were at a store she tried to get into his locked truck, for that reason he felt it was best to give the gun to his neighbor James who live next door to him [REDACTED].

I then spoke with the witness [REDACTED]. She stated she came out of [REDACTED] last night and saw the defendant talking with his [REDACTED] and Mrs. [REDACTED] was standing back while they spoke. The defendant then told the [REDACTED] he would drive them home but [REDACTED] did not want them to go with her. [REDACTED] said she was concerned there would be an incident and suggested she drive them home in her car. The defendant became angry and as they left the [REDACTED] he followed. [REDACTED] said she was afraid because the defendant was following so closely she feared he would hit her. [REDACTED] said she did not want to go to her house because he was following. She stated to me she drive south on [REDACTED] [REDACTED] said the defendant's bumper was so closed to her car she feared for her safety and the safety of everyone in the car. [REDACTED] said she then went [REDACTED] all the while the defendant is following closely and at times driving next to her car and she was afraid he was going to cause an accident. [REDACTED] turned west on [REDACTED] because she did not think the defendant would follow them there because it is not on the way home. [REDACTED] said while this was going on the [REDACTED] were crying and it was chaotic in the car. [REDACTED] made a U turn and got back on [REDACTED] traveling north in an attempt to get away from the defendant and drive to the police station. [REDACTED] said she was so nervous she could not remember where the police department was and she turned left on [REDACTED]. She decided to head to [REDACTED] because her [REDACTED] there and it takes a code to get in. [REDACTED] said she felt they would be safe because the defendant could not follow them in to the gated community. [REDACTED] turned north on [REDACTED] Street and drive to the entrance of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said there was a Comcast truck stopped on one lane and she pulled up on the lane to put the code in. The defendant pulled in and the nose of his truck was between her car and the Comcast truck to a point where he could not move unless she did. [REDACTED] opened the gate and the defendant was so close behind her he followed her in before the gate came down. Mrs. [REDACTED] said she was so nervous and the [REDACTED] were crying so much that she made an immediate left into a parking spot and he pulled in behind her preventing her from leaving. [REDACTED] said the defendant came up to her car window and began banging on the window yelling obscenities and yelling that they cannot take his [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] put her hand on the horn and kept it pressed to get the defendant to leave all the while the [REDACTED] are screaming and crying. Also, [REDACTED] called 911 and stayed on the phone with dispatch. The defendant got back in the truck and backed out, he then pulled forward and [REDACTED] thought he was going to hit her car. The defendant back up and pulled forward several more times. She heard the defendant yell that he wants his [REDACTED] and you don't know who you are messing with. The defendant then pulled his car to the gate causing it to left but he just stopped there while she was on the phone with 911. The defendant then pulled forward but stopped at [REDACTED] and got out of his truck. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] screamed that she believes he has his gun on him but [REDACTED] did not see it. The defendant then got back in his truck and drive off south on [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] explained she knows the family from [REDACTED] and had seen the defendant when he is on drugs and when he is not on drugs. [REDACTED] believed from his behavior that the defendant was on drugs and she was concerned for her safety and the safety of everyone in the car.

The defendant was transported to St. Lucie County Jail for violation of Florida State Statute 787.02 False Imprisonment two counts and Florida State Statute 787.02 (1a) Aggravated Battery.
